Music Notes...

"The Greatest Story Ever Told."

One of the more cherished easter time traditions in the Uddenberg household is watching "Easter-themed" movies. *The Ten Commandments, Jesus of Nazareth, Easter Parade* are but a few of the choices that have made the viewing list.

One of the more well-known Hollywood treatments of the passion story is the film, *The Greatest Story Ever Told*. I'm not endorsing this film, or any film that tells the story of Jesus' death and resurrection, but this title has inspired some thoughts in me this year. It seems a bit boastful in a way, but this film title, in a way, speaks to the impact that the story of this one man from a small city in the middle east has had on humankind for the last 2 millennia. For us as Christians, this title speaks to the importance of the continuation of sharing this story during the period we call in our tradition The Three Days. This story tells of the core of our beliefs, The Almighty God of Abraham gifted to humankind a human son whose destiny was to suffer agony and death on a cross so that our original sin would be forgiven by the love and grace of the creator and that this truth would be revealed to us by Jesus' resurrection three days after his death. We need to hear this story, over and over. We need to be reminded of the promise made to us by God through Abraham and fulfilled by Jesus Christ. We are obligated to our ancestors to retell and share this story to our children. This is what Holy Week is all about. This is what Easter is all about. This is the story our faith is built on. This is the story we need to hear again and again. This is why we gather for services and why we should gather again and again. It is the story we once again will tell the week of April 2-9.

Come and be a part of the sharing. Bring your family and friends. Read the word, serve communion, play an instrument, raise your voice in song, serve others. This is how we tell and share this story. Service times and days are on the front page of this Tidings. Be a part of the Greatest Story Ever Told, again.

Why Should You Give to Prince of Peace?

What's in it for me? A common question one might ask when someone is trying to sell you on some idea, product or investment. It's also a fair question to ask when someone is asking you to donate money to a cause.

For instance, if you donate money to public radio or television, you get to support continued operation of a service you enjoy or if you donate to a charity that supports medical research you get to know that you are helping to support a cure for and support for people afflicted by a disease. You get the idea.

Certainly, when you donate to Prince of Peace, you are supporting the continued operation of a place of worship that you probably visit and get value from regularly.

However, if we take a spiritual look at property, we must acknowledge that God really owns everything (Psalm 24:1). You might say, well, what I have is mine, I earned it with my intelligence and hard work. But God could answer that he made everything in the Universe before you could earn it. So why doesn't God just take back some of what is his and give it to the church to support his work and not rely on us to voluntarily fund it? That is a mystery. Maybe it is because God is teaching us a lesson about not relying just on ourselves to meet our needs but rather on a mutual community and God's grace and love. By learning to give up some of what God entrusts to us to manage, we are learning that we shouldn't rely on just our own hard work or cunningness or whatever else it is we think makes us capable of meeting our own needs but rather to rely more on God to take care of us. After all, our greatest need is for salvation from our sins and that is something we can never earn for ourselves no matter how hard and intelligently we work for it.

"So, what's the point?"

Let's talk about the Easter bunny. It crossed my mind that some of the non-Christian students who participated in Peace Camp back in February did not know what "the point" is to the Easter bunny. As Christians we know there is no theological reason that the bunny is part of this holiday. The best answer I could come up with is that what the Easter bunny is to Easter morning is the same concept as what Santa Claus is to Christmas. For those who read my December article, I explored the idea that Santa teaches children to have faith so their foundation is created early in life. I intend to explore a similar idea here.

Here is what the History channel says on the subject:

"According to some sources, the Easter bunny first arrived in America in the 1700s with German immigrants who settled in Pennsylvania and transported their tradition of an egg-laying hare called "Osterhase" or "Oschter Haws." Their children made nests in which this creature could lay its colored eggs. Eventually, the custom spread across the U.S. and the fabled rabbit's Easter morning deliveries expanded to include chocolate and other types of candy and gifts, while decorated baskets replaced nests. Additionally, children often left out carrots for the bunny in case he got hungry from all his hopping."



Here's what I'm thinking; Easter morning is full of surprises, and faith is tested in early stages of Mary Magdalene's grief. John 20 says:

"[Jesus] asked [Mary Magdalene], "Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher") Jesus said, [...] Go to my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father, and your Father, to my God, and your God.' Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news."

* For those of you who grew up watching The Story Keepers, this particular passage was wonderfully done. You can find the episode on YouTube if you are interested. *

Mary's first instinct is, of course, that Jesus is not Jesus speaking to her, since she witnessed his death, and took part in his burial. Personally, I would have turned sooner in anger in the "scene" to demand this "gardener" disclose the location of Jesus' body. Seeing Jesus' body taken from His tomb is like expecting an egg in a colorful Easter egg. But instead, metaphorically, Mary found "candy". Jesus, metaphorically, was the adult who knew where the Easter eggs were, and had to reveal the location of the eggs that were still missing.

I explore these major events in our church calendar to provide examples of how being a Christian today still makes sense, rather than seeing the stories at face value. Being a disciple the job is to spread the good news, pretty much as it's written. Being a youth minister means you figure out how the stories are still relevant. Here's hoping the point comes across clearly.

We have always strived to spend time with Stephanie and her family and insure both boys know the real reason for the colorful eggs and chocolate bunnies. Jesus sent us out to care for others and be His arms and legs. That's just what Stephen Ministers do!

Both of our mothers were born and married in April. We've buried them both. My mom's final years were full of pain that doctors were unable to curb. My calendar was conflicted since she lived in the Quad Cities and I had a family, job and multiple obligations here. I was and continue to be grateful for the many church members who visited her on a regular basis, to bring some sweets and hear her same tales of her family over and over. Mom's death in 1997 is what inspired me to help others in a similar vein and become a Stephen Minister. Bob's mom lived nearby allowing me to visit regularly. She loved our trips to Wendy's to sit and listen to Stephanie tell her tales. It was a girls' lunch; no men invited. His mom helped encircle Stephanie with the unique love of a grandmother, a task still so ever close to me. (You did know I was a grandmother, didn't you?) Their marriages weren't always ideal thus giving me more insight into a topic unfortunately common with our care receivers.

We end the month with a jolt of rambunctious reality with Moe's birthday. He will turn three on the 26th. Puppyhood brought many big medical moments when we were encouraged to put him down. Emotions flowed freely with each trip to the vet and large bills to pay. Moe now bounds throughout our halls bringing laughter to our lives. He daily reminds us of the value of having something or someone in our lives who brings us joys and makes us forget (at least for a while) about aches and pains. That's another lesson I can share with our Stephen Ministry team. They each bring joy into the lives of the care receivers.

I feel blessed to be part of our Stephen Leader team. I am able to be surrounded by caring members of this congregation who take a pause in the midst of their busy lives to go listen to the needs of others. They have family and some even have parents turning 100. They take trips to Disney and have get-away homes in Wisconsin. You can see them weekly in our church kitchen adding their loving touches to the fellowship hour. They have worked as nurses, engineers and pre-school teachers. They are parents and grandparents who still manage to donate some time to caring for their church family. Their busyness doesn't interfere with their ability to share time with the needs of their church family.

We are starting a new class this September and we really need others to join us. I ask you to please prayerfully consider this opportunity. Don't look at your child's sports schedule or any other aspect of your busy life. Know there are people hurting who just want someone to listen to them. PADS Update - April 2023

Prince of Peace will continue to provide healthy meal boxes to the 150 homeless clients housed in area hotels. Food items being collected at the Friday morning drop offs in the church parking lot include bread, cereal, peanut butter, jelly, bananas, oranges, apples, carrots, grape tomatoes, mini peppers, tuna or canned salmon, granola bars and trail mix. "Helping the Hands that Heal" Global Health Ministries

GHM is an independent Lutheran nonprofit that partners with Lutheran health systems serving some of the most vulnerable people in Africa, Asia, and Central America. Medical equipment and supplies are shipped

where needed. GHM also offers grants and volunteer consultants to help health systems build their capacity to provide services in their communities.

Our missionary in Tanzania, Dr. Steven Friberg, benefits from the equipment and supplies provided by GHM.

In their recent newsletter, GHM reported that 33,630 boxes full of equipment and supplies worth \$4.4 million were sent to almost 190 health centers and nursing schools in 6 countries in 2022. These gifts from GHM help retain doctors and nurses in places where conditions are difficult.

A doctor in Liberia thanked GHM for providing the equipment in his operating room—masks, gloves, surgery table, scalpel, etc., making it possible for him to "follow his call from God to serve the people here." An elderly woman in El Salvador wanted to help her neighbors suffering from health problems. With her pastor's help, she was trained to be a health promoter, and now she is teaching younger women to be health promoters.

At Selian Lutheran Hospital in Tanzania, the staff prays together each morning and sometimes dedicates their offerings to the "Charity Fund", which helps the poorest patients pay for their care. In Madagascar, a Community Health Nurse gives out newborn kits to new mothers to encourage them to come to the clinic for prenatal care, and to return for immunizations and well-baby checks.

Souper Bowl of Caring—Stock a Backpack with Food

The Souper Bowl of Caring campaign scored two touchdowns on Super Bowl Sunday! Over \$600 was collected which will be sent in to ELCA to support their nationwide weekend lunch programs for needy kids. That is at least 60 backpacks of food for families to have healthy meals over the weekend and for kids to be nourished and ready to learn when back at school.

Sunday school children and the congregation also filled many bags with groceries which were picked up by Hanover Township to supplement their food pantry items. The pantry is currently serving 1600 families a month so the township is extremely grateful for our collection and support.

Food connects people—thank you for making an impact on hunger in our community.


