Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth. Worship the LORD with gladness; come into God's presence with singing. (Psalm 100:1-2)

You will need to set up a user ID and password.

Once you have created your account the easiest ways to participate will be through your phone/ tablet and/or on a personal computer.

- See a directory of church members and the information they have shared with other church members
- Decide what personal information you and your family want to be visible to other church members.

Note: If you have privacy concerns you can make changes, but all of this information will be visible to the other POP realm users until you change your privacy settings.

We know it is a change and there may be questions. We will have a table in the fellowship hall or narthex each week after church to help everyone create an account and answer any questions. As we learn more about Realm, we hope this additional channel will become an easier way for us to connect and communicate with each other.

# Not the End of the Road

I think one of the best ways to teach or lead is to show by example. It has been working for me so far in my youth ministry endeavors this year. But as I wrack my brain to create a special Affirmation of Baptism weekend for our 9th graders, I cannot remember the Bible verse that I picked for my own Affirmation of Baptism. I bet it is right there on the certificate from 2010 (yikes!), something about singing, most likely a psalm because those are my favorite. Some members of our congregation would be able to recite their own Bible verses from memory; those especially who made their living working in the church. Does this make me an inferior director of our youth? Nah.

Before doing this job, I always thought the act of affirming one's baptism made things so final. I can guess that similar thinking is the reason many students don't continue to participate in church activities after their Affirmation of Baptism. Often, you don't see those kids ever again. It's concerning to me because the act of affirming your baptism should actually have the opposite effect on students. Without a parent working in the church, who says what 14-year-old Emily would have done post-Confirmation?

I would love to change this narrative within our congregation. But this is something I cannot do alone. Leading by example, integrating families with younger children into our congregation to make church feel like a safe place, and part of their routine is a fabulous way to start. And in a lot of ways, we already have! Embracing the little ones early on in their Christian education makes the transition into the "adult church" experience that much more natural.

I do not expect any of the confirmation students to have all the answers by May 21, 2023. I hope that there are enough unanswered questions that students wish to come back to church to find the answers they are looking for. Even as someone who is leading the charge in this exploration, I don't have all the answers! I would like to think I have more now than I did on the day of my Affirmation of Baptism. This particular declaration is not the end of the road of growing into one's faith. It is actually the very beginning.

Viator House of Hospitality provides compassionate accompaniment of young adult male immigrants seeking asylum. It provides a supportive living environment, including physical and mental health care, while they await court proceedings that determine whether they can become U.S. citizens. In the meantime, the young men learn English, go to school (including college and trade schools), volunteer, follow their faith traditions, learn to drive, and find jobs.

As a Faith Community Partner with VHH, we are collecting bedding supplies for new arrivals, and hygiene supplies for all the guys. ALDI gift cards will buy food for the 25 young men. We are also asking for equipment that will enrich their lives via outdoor activities.
